168, The Clasp Class, Thursday, March 23, 8:30 am – 4:00 pm

Materials: Safety glasses, digital caliper (available at Harbor Freight and Radio Shack for around \$20), scribe or fine point marker, basic jewelry making tools, including: round nose pliers, flat nose pliers, chain nose pliers, hand files or needle files, jeweler's saw and blades (#3/0 or #4/0), small hammer, metal shears, rawhide mallet, bench pin, bench block, sandpaper/polishing papers optional: 3" or 4" C-Clamp (or other clamp) sometimes needed to clamp bench pin to table work light magnifying glasses or optivisor

200, Stacking Stones, Friday, March 24, 8:30 am – 4:00 pm

Materials: Students should bring the following tools Safety glasses, basic Jewelry making tools - round nose pliers, flat nose pliers, wire cutters, hand files or Needle File Set – round, half-round, flat, triangle, etc., Bezel pusher, bezel roller or burnisher, bench pin, bench block or anvil and anvil pillow to dampen sound, jeweler's saw and blades (size #3/0 or 4/0), Calipers (Digital calipers are available at Harbor Freight for around \$20), Rawhide Mallet Ball-peen hammer or goldsmithing hammer or other type of small hammer for riveting. Optional: ring clamp, Loupe, Magnifying glasses or Optivisor, small Machinist Square (2" size or larger), Miter Cutting Vise/Jig

203, Ketoh Bracelet, Saturday, March 25 and Sunday, March 26, 8:30 am – 4:00 pm

Materials: Bring a leather belt (or part of a belt approx. 8 inches long x 1.5 inches wide x approx. 1/8 inch thick). Basic jewelry making tools will be needed, including round nose and flat nose pliers, wire cutters, hand files or needle files, small hammer for tube setting, metal shears, jeweler's saw and blades (# 3/0 or 4/0), bench pin, bench block or anvil, safety glasses, mallet. Optional: texturing hammers, metal stamps, 1.25mm or 1.80mm hole punch, decorative silver wire (patterned wire, half-bead wire, etc.)
